



Some pupils will have progressed further and will: recognise familiar language in a story and use clues to work out the meanings of some unfamiliar words, name members of a family, follow and give some instructions which describe movement and have some geographical knowledge of Rhyl and produce some words linked to the seaside from memory.



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
Simple Directions for Movement (PE)






Rhyl is a seaside town in North Wales (*United Kingdom*).
